Did you know?

According to Florida Statute 1827.41(3), if you are a household member to the victim of domestic violence your employer must allow you to take up to 3 working days of leave in a 12-month period.

*You must be employed for at least 3 months and your employer must employ 50 or more employees for this law to apply.

Perpetrators of domestic violence often manipulate current or former intimate partners or other family members through learned behaviors. Verbal, physical, sexual, financial, or emotional - domestic violence is not always a singular action often it is a series of exploitative tactics that force survivors to act in undesirable ways or prevent them from doing what they want.

VICTIMS RIGHTS

In a civil case of domestic violence, you have specific rights in a court of law. CASA advocates can help you understand the following Victim Rights Statute:

- Victim Impact Statement §96A.001(1)(A)
- Right to be present and heard §96A.001(1)(B)
- Right to be accompanied by a victim advocate
- Right to request restraining order §96A.001(1)(C)
- Right to apply for victim compensation §96A.001(1)(D)
- Domestic violence relocation
- Address confidentiality
- Self-defense

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE WARNING SIGNS?

- Extreme jealousy
- Intimidation and threats
- Blame for the partner's problems, feelings, & mistakes
- Excessive criticism, control, and jealousy
- Possessiveness
- Threats, demands, and/or systematically abusive behavior
- Some indicators that domestic violence could turn deadly
- Jealousy
- Threats to kill
- Access to weapons, use of or threats to use weapons
- Violence of previous order
- Hoarding

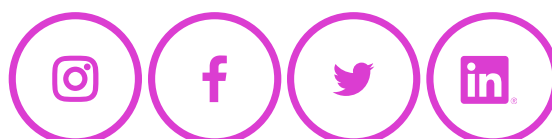

Lariana Forsythe joined Community Action Stops Abuse --or CASA-- as its CEO in 2017. With more than 20 years of nonprofit experience with the Boys & Girls Clubs, National Multiple Sclerosis Society, and Special Olympics, Ms. Forsythe earned a Master's Degree in Business Administration from the University of Phoenix on scholarship while a full-time, single mom, a Bachelor of Science from Arizona State University, and is a Certified Fund Raising Executive (CFRE).

The Tampa Bay Business Journal named Ms. Forsythe Business Woman of the Year in 2018. Ms. Forsythe currently serves as a board member for the Pinellas County Homeless Leadership Board as well as a member of the St. Anthony's Hospital's Mission Integration and Community Affairs Committee.

With Ms. Forsythe's leadership, CASA has received various national and local accolades for its innovative services and program launches. In 2021, CASA began serving as the provider of domestic violence training and technical assistance for the State of Florida.

In 2022 CASA opened Florida's only Family Justice Center and in 2023 was awarded the prestigious Purple Ribbon Award for best new domestic violence service launch for the CASA Family Justice Center in the United States.

In 2024 CASA expanded its physical footprint in Pinellas County, opening a satellite office providing housing, advocacy, and injunction for protection legal services in Clearwater.

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
